Corona-Norco Unified School District (CNUSD) Trustee District Proposal

From Kevin Bash:

Recently it was announced that the Corona-Norco Unified School District, in an effort to comply with the California and Federal voting rights acts and avoid potential and expensive lawsuits, would be considering breaking the district of 220,000 residents into five trustee areas.

There are two maps being considered and should the school board vote to change, it would require that Trustees live in the area they represent.

The problem with both plans is they dramatically break up Norco in such a way that our community would likely never be represented by a Norconian - much like the situation we have now. Our small population of voters simply cannot compete with the larger communities of Corona and Eastvale. If Norco could stand alone, which, is likely not possible given the laws in place, it might be a benefit and ensure a home grown voice for our community. However, as the maps appear today, both would break Norco into pieces that would be attached to larger population areas of Corona and Eastvale - meaning, it would be very difficult for a Norconian to be elected.

It must be noted - while there is currently no Norconian on the board, the most recent Trustees have been attentive to our community's educational needs. However, both Kathy Azevedo and myself have been very attentive and active within the district to ensure we are represented. One can only think that it would be to our benefit to once again have a Norconian on the CNUSD Board.
