George Ingalls Veterans Memorial Plaza

Who is George Ingalls?

George A. Ingalls was a Norco resident who died in Vietnam on April 16, 1967 and posthumously received the Congressional Medal of Honor. Army Specialist Ingalls threw himself onto a grenade to save the lives of the members of his squad. His gallantry and selfless devotion to his comrades were in keeping with the highest tradition of the military service and the United States Army. As a youth, George was involved with local sports, attending Norco Junior High, and Corona High School. Ingalls was also the president of the youth group at the Community Church of Norco. George Ingalls had a sense of loyalty not only to his sports teams, but to his family, his church, his community and his country. Because of his dedication and supreme sacrifice, the City of Norco has named its largest park in his honor, George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center.

You may buy a multiple year license, depending on the rabies vaccination expiration date. The rabies vaccination must be valid through the full license period.

Altered Dogs

1-Year license \$20.00; 2-Year license \$37.00; 3-Year license \$55.00
Penalty – \$25.00 late fee for any dog license 30 or more days late

Unaltered Dogs

1-Year license \$50.00; 2-Year license \$88.00; 3-Year license \$120.00
Penalty – \$25.00 late fee for any dog license 30 or more days late

Seniors 62+ may receive a discount ONLY if their dogs are altered.

1-Year license \$4.00; 2-Year license \$6.00; 3-Year license \$10.00
Penalty – \$25.00 for tags purchased 30 or more days late

Replacement Tags: Lost or Unreadable tag replacement \$4.00. **All fees include a \$2 Maintenance Fee**

Treasurers Report: Shirley Henderson absent; the updated amount: \$7,418.29.

Old Business: Elections for the RURAL Board. Nominations from the floor and voting on each of the nominations was immediate. The Board voted in this year for RURAL is: President - Pat Overstreet; Vice Pres.- Kathy Kramer ; Secretary- Doris Higgins; Treasurer- Denise Sutherland; Newsletter- Dana Adams

New Business: Initiation of newly elected board members.

Guest Speakers: Richard Hallum and Dan Chamberlin were our guest speakers. They spoke regarding the newly formed Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.S). Richard gave a brief description of the C.E.R.T.S. expectations and

responsibilities. Starting with the basic background information of the entire concept beginning with the L.A. Fire Department and F.E.M.A. in 1994. 20 hours of training gives each volunteer the "basics" of emergency response with first responders responsibilities. The volunteer can continue extended advanced training to even allow

response to out-of-state disasters. The primary concern taught the volunteers was: Safety first for self and family, then others. In case of a disaster, an "assessing" would be made at the disaster scene for damages and injuries. Basic First Aid is taught to all the volunteers in the C.E.R.T.S. program. Greatest Good for the Greatest Number is their motto. C.E.R.T.S. is looking for all volunteers over 18 yrs. of age; with any physical abilities. Even those of us who believe we may be "too old" or "too physically challenged" can hold down a duty for this organization. Next class is scheduled for Oct.

4, 5 and 6th, but many more will be scheduled. Just contact Norco City Hall and offer your talents to help in case of an emergency or disaster situation. All are welcome

If you did attend, please take in all the answers each candidate gave and evaluate to make the best choice for your vote in November. For

the three other candidates who have had no background in Norco city dealings and chose NOT to attend, YOU were missed.
