SPEAKER: Councilman Ted Hoffman, Mayor Pro Tem

- Reminded those present to attend the State of the City by Mayor Newton at Nellie Weaver Hall 3/30 at 6:00 pm
- Veteran's executive Banners available through City Hall. If you have any questions you can check with Councilman Ted Hoffman or call City Hall.
- Discussed the possible need for higher taxes due to the City's budget constraints. The Strategic Plan was shared and discussed, primarily about the \$4 1/2 million needed increase, to meet the basic infra structure/capitol improvement needs. Two firms have been hired to check the entire feasibility on how to cover the yearly projected deficiencies. It may end up being a vote of the citizens to make the ultimate decisions. The General fund and the appropriate reserves are met, but dealing with the revenues needed for the infra structure/capitol improvement is of concern. A full public education program for all citizens is imperative in order for everyone to understand the need and when/if it goes on the ballot, people can make their votes count. (This involves: roads, city buildings & parks, storm drains and streets and trails.) The two primary companies to for revenue source generators is: Lew Edwards Group and FM3 (Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz and Associates). The full survey must be completed by June this year. Extensive question / answer period for clarification followed.

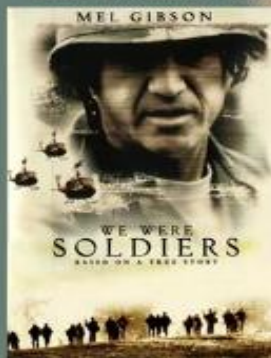


