Speaker: Kathy Azevedo – Silverlakes update on Equestrian Center Activities and events.

While Silverlakes has not built the world class equestrian that was promised, it is still being proposed. The plan is to move the existing area to the south side of the property adjacent to the river bottom. This will be the perfect location as equestrians that are camping or competing can also ride our beautiful trails. Silverlakes will assure trail connectivity. Silverlakes is requesting to rent an additional 8 to 10 acres to be able to add stables, equestrian camping, and a large covered arena. Currently it's going through the EIR process and once it's complete it will go to city council for approval. In the meantime, the Ranch at Silverlakes has been hosting a variety of horse shows and other equestrian events. So far, they have hosted hunter/jumper shows, classical and western dressage, gymkhana play days, reining, and evening obstacle course shows. They hosted the PRCA rodeo queen competition and many equestrian clinics. What has been the most successful are the Ranch Riding Buckle Series and the Sunday Series. The Ranch Riding shows were explained in detail what is actually executed by the horse and rider and the different levels of competition. The Sunday Series is Cowboy Dressage and an obstacle course. Cowboy dressage was also explained. These series are both held monthly and run for three months. There is a spring and fall series.

The Ranch has even more shows on the horizon for 2019. Every month there will be an evening obstacle course shows on the second Wednesday night. They will be hosting a Friesian Clinic in February and Judy Bonham, who does a lot of judging at Silverlakes, is considering a summer series for primarily beginner riders who want to compete. The Ranch Riding Buckle Series and The Sunday Series will be their signature events and continue through 2019.

A power point was presented with lots of photos and a video. Flyers and other horse show related material was distributed.

Future Meetings: There will be no meeting in November. The Christmas Potluck will be held Sunday, December 16, 2018 at the Overstreet Residence.
