- Vector Control meetings are warning everyone about any breeding locations for mosquitoes. It can be large like an abandoned swimming pool or a drop of water under a leaf, the mosquitoes will find a way to populate the area. Check your yard and around your house to clear out cans, buckets, pet water bowls, water sources for your horses or any of your animals. Any and all sources allowing water to stagnate and mosquitoes to breed. Many devastating diseases are showing up in our area. Just to name a few: Zika Virus, Denque Fever, Yellow Fever, West Nile and Chikungunkya. Check out the symptoms and problems with your computer and be sure to educate yourself, in order to protect yourself.
- Information shared on the R.T.A. buses serving our area and the RCTC results of the toll roads/express lanes. (687+ new transponders have been supplied alone!). Fees are being raised as we read this newsletter. And get ready for the #15 freeway construction that will be directly involving Norco also.
- More discussion on the SB1 bill which will help enlarge and rebuild the Hamner Bridge (the bridge between Detroit St and the City of Eastvale on Hamner Avenue). The plan allows for 3 lanes both ways.
- Community Survey on possibly raising our city sales tax to help rebuild the streets in Norco. 549 citizens were surveyed (out of 11,000 registered voters). Look for this to possibly be put on the voting ballot of the future. Learn as much as you can about what can be done to help our city, and vote accordingly when the time arises.
